

She looks forward to racing opportunities before the 2021 Olympics in Tokyo. Travel permitting, the team will compete in the upcoming World Cups and Championship before racing in Japan.

Bouncing back from COVID-19, UWA Boat Club is back in the boat



In a challenging year for people across the globe, we have worked hard to retain university students and members of the community to healthy eating and exercise.

International Representation

Olympic hopeful and Club member Bronwyn Cox was selected in the Australian Women's Eight. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all national and international events were cancelled, including the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. She is continuing her training into 2021 for a renewed Olympic campaign.

Club Awards

Over the 2020 season, Rowing WA promoted participation at all levels in the regatta season and chose to not award pennant points for the 2020 season.

Welcome to our new High-Performance Coach

The Club welcomed new high-performance coach Ethan Aird in 2020, after the departure of previous coach Stefano Balosso. Ethan has been a high performing athlete over many years at UWA Boat Club and we look forward to him joining the coaching team and leading the squad to Nationals at Lake Barrington, Tasmania in 2021.



Forrest Hall

The construction of the second Forrest Hall building has continued in 2020. The Boat Club has been assured uninterrupted boat trailer access to the Boat Shed for transporting equipment to and from regattas during construction and upon completion. The University is awaiting Ministerial approval to construct a new boat ramp from the concrete apron to the water's edge. Finally, a dive report in late 2019 identified structural defects in the pontoon and replacement of the substructure was approved in February 2020. Given the pandemic, the University has postponed the pontoon project along with many other projects on campus indefinitely. However, the pre-approval means that the substructure will be one of the first projects tendered when the University recommences their spending programs.

Australian Bush Fire Relief and Shenton College

Congratulations to George White and the Shenton College Rowing Program for organising a bush fire appeal in early February 2020. A 24-hour ergathon was held at the school which raised over \$3,500 for the CFA & Brigades' Donations Fund and the NSW Wildlife Information, Rescue, and Education Service Inc. Most donations were from the Shenton community and was an excellent promotion of our rowing culture and led to student recruitment at the commencement of the school year. In addition, we are now a KidSport-eligible Club. KidSport is a WA State Government initiative to assist low income families in covering membership fees in local community sports.

We would like to thank Lotterywest for their contribution to maintaining our program during the pandemic. We also thank Michael Hawkins, who was one of the Boat Race Officials who adjudicate our regattas. Without his volunteering, our regattas could not happen. Our Club is proud of our members volunteering in the community.

UWA – UWA Sports – UWA Boat Club Partnership

Our partnership continues to improve with UWA Sports committed to supporting successful UWA sporting clubs. We are in regular communication with the UWA Sports Students' Council and other UWA Sports Club Presidents. We have been offered large discounts for a limited number of UWA Gym memberships to promote our high-performance program.

Nationals training back at the Canning Bridge annex began the week of the 14th of September with private boats and some doubles and one dinghy moved to the Canning shed. For the 2021 Nationals season we have a squad of nine athletes coached by high performance coach Ethan Aird.

Fundraising & Community Activities

UWABC members achieved a lot this year despite the unpredictable nature of the season. It is evident how passionate our members are about the club and the community when reviewing the number of fundraisers and activities we completed over the short season.

Our T1 athletes fundraised for equipment and to cover the cost of attending Nationals through a sold-out Australia Day Dinner at the Boat Club and a 24-hour ergathon. These initiatives were very successful and helped reduce the costs associated with the Nationals program. These fundraisers also helped purchase new spin bikes and stroke coaches.

Due to the shutdown this year, we had one large Learn 2 Row group this year, coordinated by Ruth Dogovski, and subsequently 12 new members have joined the Novice Men's squad. They have commenced their rowing with the enthusiastic support of the Novice Men's coaches.

For the second year in a row we ran a Clean Up Australia Day event around Matilda Bay. The general public joined in with our club members to remove rubbish from the bank in time for our start of season.



Unfortunately, the Club's closure during the lockdown heavily dampened our ordinary fundraising efforts. Despite this, Harry Cooke created and sold club stickers and limited-edition stubby holders to fundraise over this time which was a huge success amongst alumni and current members.

Once the club reopened and the regatta season was updated, we hosted the Masters State Championships. Thank you to everyone who volunteered or donated, it was a huge success! No pennant points were awarded this season and UWABC won the SunSmart competition at the Club State Championships. Staying protected from the sun leading up to the regatta helped us win a new SunSmart marquee which was very useful over the weekend and will be used at regattas in the future.

To end the season our fundraising would not be complete without a Bunnings BBQ. Thank you to everyone who helped sell over 300 hotdogs at Claremont Bunnings.



Grants

Earlier this year the committee applied for a grant with the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries and Lotterywest. Funding was made available to state-wide community organisations impacted by COVID-19 to maintain viability. Our application was successful and contributed to insurance, leases, registrations, maintenance and other fees.

Membership

Overall member numbers decreased significantly by 30% to 211. Our tertiary student numbers dropped by around 50% (both UWA and Other Universities), Shenton numbers by 16% but Ordinary member numbers remained stable.




Figure 4: Spread of members by type.




Figure 5: Membership breakdown by squad.


