# UWA COMES THIRD OVERALL IN UNISPORT NATIONALS

**UniSport Nationals** (formerly IntersVarsity, University Games) was held at Champion Lakes, Perth this year. UWA came third in the overall points tally behind the University of Sydney and the University of Technology Sydney (UTS).

The Mens' Coxed Eight were in a hotly contested race and ultimately came fourth in the Oxford and Cambridge Cup after being overcome by Sydney, UTS, and Adelaide.

The Women's Coxed Four won a bronze medal in the Lady Margaret Cup after finishing behind UTS and 0.69 sec behind Sydney.

We congratulate all our competitors for travelling from around Australia to compete in Perth. Further results on the other events are available in the President's Report.

Thanks to the pledges and donations of our generous alumni, the Boat Club christened a new men's coxed eight in 2022: the *Centenary of UWABC*. We are extremely grateful to the Chancellor of UWA and former Chief Justice of the High Court of Australia the Hon. Robert French AC and his wife Ms Valerie French, District Court Judge, ret, for helping us to name our new boat.



Mr French spoke of the 100 years of the Boat Club on the shores of Matilda Bay. He reiterated the importance of both the university student experience and the role of the Boat Club and other sporting clubs to develop university students into graduates. He emphasised the deep connections that students make within their clubs and the value that sporting clubs provide to the student life of the university, the attraction of future students, and the reengagement of UWA alumni.

In addition to speaking to the whole group, Mr French also spent time with our current members. This was particularly valuable to Oliver Hoare (pictured above, left) as he concludes his Juris Doctor studies at UWA this year. Over 50 current members and alumni attended the boat christening together with UWA Sport staff and those following along with a live stream of the event online. The boat naming ceremony was expertly organised by Karlie Payne, Vice President of Alumni Relations with audio visual assistance provided by Imogen Blow.

# UNISPORTS NATIONALS (IV) RETURNS TO CHAMPION LAKES



## *World Rowing Championships: 3rd*

Bronwyn Cox was selected in the Australian Senior A Rowing Team after her excellent performance in the Australian Women's Eight at last year's Tokyo Olympic Games. This year, Bronwyn trained at the Women's Hancock Prospecting National Training Centre in Penrith, NSW and competed at World Rowing Cup 2 in Poznan, POL; World Rowing Cup 3 in Lucerne, SUI; and the World Rowing Championships in Racice, CZE. After winning a Gold Medal in the Women's Coxless Four at World Rowing Cup 2 and an historic Gold Medal in the Women's Eight at World Rowing Cup 3, Bronwyn's crew won an exemplary Bronze Medal in the Women's Coxless Four at the World Rowing Championships in September 2022. The indomitable spirit of

UWABC is exemplified by Bronnie on the world stage and her fellow Club members continue to cheer her on from Perth.

## *Intersarsity Results*

UniSport Nationals (formerly Intervarsity, University Games) was held at Champion Lakes, Perth. The men's eight came 4<sup>th</sup> in the Oxford and Cambridge Cup and the women's coxed four won a bronze medal in the Lady Margaret Cup. In the single sculls, UWA won gold and bronze in the women's single, silver in the men's lightweight single, and silver in the men's single. In the women's coxless pair, UWA won bronze. UWA also won bronze in the men's lightweight coxless four. Finally, UWA won gold in the mixed coxed four and bronze in the mixed coxed eight.

## *Club Awards*

UWABC was awarded the 2022 Champion Club of the Year by Rowing WA. The Champion Club is recognised for having the best attraction of new members, retention of previous members, and participation in regattas to grow the sport of rowing. We have won this award from 2013-22 (except for 2020 where no awards were made). In the Premiership Pennant, UWABC came third with a notable second place in B-Grade, first in C-Grade, second in D-Grade, and third in the Masters' Pennant. Bronwyn Cox was awarded Oarswoman of the Year. The Boat Club was also the runner-up in the UWA Sport's Champion Club award.

## *Thank You To Our High-Performance Coach George White*

The Club thanks its high-performance coach George White for coaching over the 2021-22 nationals and pennant seasons. George has been an excellent high-performance coach for our top athletes while also contributing to the performance base all club members throughout the year and we look forward to him continuing in the role into the 2022-23 season.

## *Forrest Hall*

The construction of the second Forrest Hall building has concluded in 2022. The Boat Club has uninterrupted boat trailer access to the Boat Shed for transporting equipment to and from regattas. We have raised the profile of rowing within the Forrest Hall scholars and will be holding Learn 2 Row courses for them soon.

### *Boat Shed Jetty (Pontoon) & Sand Bank*

UWA Campus Management has commenced refurbishment of the jetty. The jetty had structural defects identified in 2019 and repairs are proceeding over September – November 2022. We look forward to reopening the pontoon to many future generations of rowers at the UWA Boat Club.



### *Mentoring*

The first ever mentoring program was held by UWABC in 2022 led by Club member Oliver Hoare. The successful program linked current university students and rowers with Club alumni for professional networking. Club member feedback has been resoundingly positive with comments that “it is extremely relevant” and “it’s good to have someone with experience you can talk to and ask questions”. We look forward to continuing this program in 2023.

### *Centenary History Book*

The book is currently in its final stages of print. All materials have been submitted to the publisher and UWA have approved the digital and print proofs. We are currently awaiting the print and delivery of all books before we organise a Book Launch early in 2023.

### *Vale*

The UWA Boat Club extends its heartfelt condolences to the friends and families of Marielle Sloss, James (Jim) Paton, and Jeremy Hobbs. Marielle was UWABC’s first female captain in 1984-85 and led the way for future female Club Captains Karlie Payne, Holly Child, and Sophie Rowe. Jim was a steadfast supporter of the Club for many decades after his captaincy in 1948 and presidency in 2005. Jim was critical to the UWA Watersports Complex’s construction and without his engagement of the local indigenous community would not have been built. Jeremy Hobbs (captain in 1978-1980) went onto help create Oxfam International which addresses global poverty at its core. They will be missed.

# STRONG RESULTS FOR NEW MEMBERS



## *National Championships*

We had a strong start to the season this year with success at the Australian Rowing Championships at Nagambie, Victoria, in which we had four state representatives: Bronwyn Cox, Thea Adamson, Clare Netherway and Cooper Anspach. In conjunction with some hard racing throughout the week, we saw UWABC's Will Hynes and Kye Binyon win a silver medal in the champion men's double scull.

## *State Championships*

Following the success of the national championships, the tone for the year. Together with High Performance Coach George White and our amazing volunteer coaches, UWABC won 26 podiums at the WA State Championships including 8 Gold Medals, 8 Silver Medals, and 10 Bronze Medals.

## *UniSport Nationals*

The UniSport Nationals' athletes (formerly University Games, Intersport) performed admirably during a successful week of racing. Volunteer coach Harry Cooke for stepped up into the manager coach role. Harry trained the crews and coordinated them throughout the week together with Tessa Bevilacqua who also coordinated with UWA Sport.



The campaign was successful with the Women's Single: 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> (R. Pretorius and L. Quinn), Women's Coxless Pair: 3<sup>rd</sup> (L. Jackson and A. Kozłowska), Men's Lightweight Single Scull: 2<sup>nd</sup> (D. Marshall), Men's Lightweight Coxless Four: 3<sup>rd</sup> (O. Hoare, C. Brace, E. Bromley, and D. Metzner), Men's Single Scull: 2<sup>nd</sup> (J. Daubney), Women's Coxed Four: 3<sup>rd</sup> (A. Kozłowska, G. Hughes, L. Quinn, R. Pretorius, and Cox: C. Anspach).

Overall, UWA came third overall in men's division, third overall in women's division, and third overall for accumulated points from all athletes.

UWABC was recognised at the Rowing WA Rower of the Year Awards by being awarded with the Champion Club of the Year. Bronwyn Cox was named the WA Oarswoman of the Year with Jeremy Gillbanks nominated as the RWA Volunteer of the Year. UWABC was placed third in the Premiership Pennant (4<sup>th</sup> in the A-Grade Pennant, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the B-Grade Pennant, 1<sup>st</sup> in the C-Grade Pennant, 2<sup>nd</sup> in the D-Grade Pennant, 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Masters' Pennant). We were also awarded 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Novice Sculling Awards.

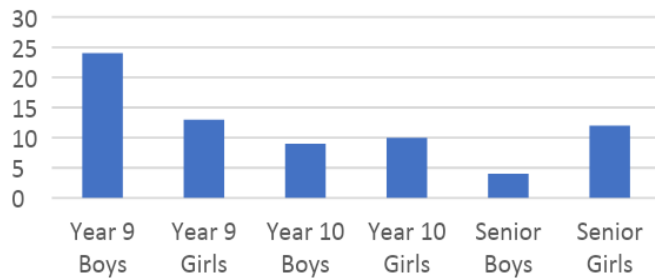
### Membership

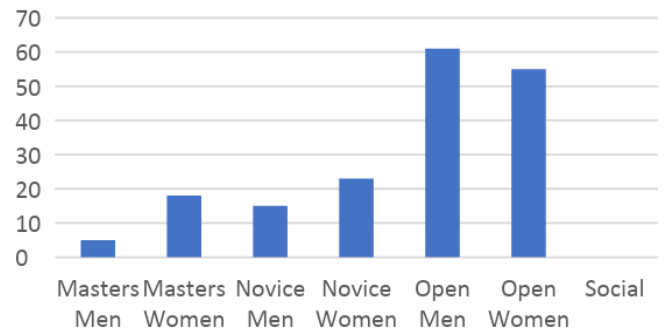
The 2022 membership age profile was made up as follows:

- At 40 and above         15%.

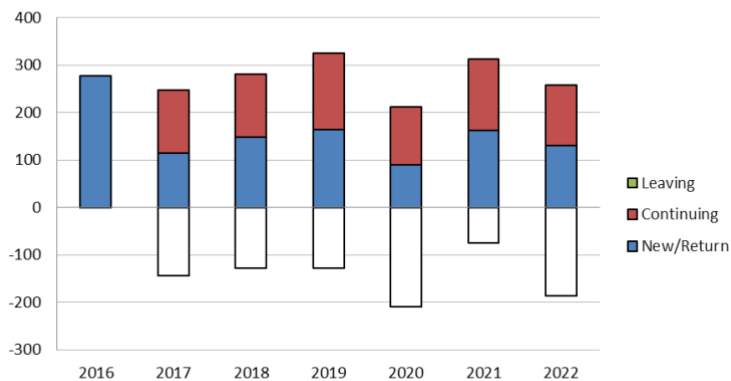
2022 Shenton College Breakdown

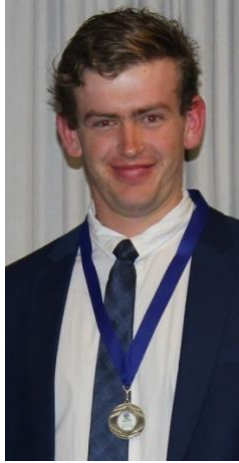
